Friends of Acton Public Library

The Friends of Acton Public Library is an organization of people dedicated to supporting the library through advocacy and fundraising. Membership is open to anyone who is interested by donating for any amount. Funds are raised mainly by means of an annual membership drive traditionally held in the spring and by selling donated books. Books, and more recently, puzzles, are sold on an A-frame bookshelf in the front lobby of the library whenever the library is open. Three larger book sales are held during the course of the year, with the largest being the Big Summer Book Sale held at the beginning of the summer season.

The funds raised are used to supplement the programming budget provided by the town, to pay for the museum passes that offer free or reduced-price admission to a number of local and regional attractions, to provide refreshments at the kick-off and windup of the Summer Reading program, to support the toiletries and personal care items available in the library restrooms. The board of the Friends meets quarterly, and there is an annual meeting in May open to all Friends members and to the community at large. New members are always welcome. Ways in which members and volunteers can help is by sorting and cleaning donated books, setting up for and staffing our periodic book sales, representing the Friends at programs that we sponsor, and advocating for the library among the local community.

Many people today think of libraries as just sources of books and media, and some wonder why, with so much available on-line, libraries still exist. But libraries have become much more than repositories and lenders of reading, listening and viewing materials. Libraries such as Acton are places where people of all ages can receive assistance in the technology that is essential to life today. Acton is a gathering place for teens, with clubs and activities to engage them, and it offers instructive programming for children, book clubs and social activities for people of all ages. The librarians help people apply for jobs and benefits, and sometimes, even assist in finding temporary or long-term housing. The library serves as a heating and cooling center.
